NEW 2-DAY WORKSHOP! Building Blocks for Achieving Quality Outcomes: An In-depth Look at FIM® Ratings and Facility-Specific Opportunities for Improvement (August 9–10, 2011, 8:30 a.m.–4:30 p.m.)

This workshop begins with instruction to analyze sample facility data and credentialing reports. This instruction can be carried over to your facility-specific reports to provide staff a clear picture of problematic areas in FIM® ratings and their impact on your facility's outcomes. Each FIM® item has been organized into an educational module that includes focused examination to help improve FIM® knowledge and documentation. This workshop will concentrate on all 18 FIM® items over 2 days.

IRF-PAI vs. UB-04 Coding: Closing the Communication Gap (August 9, 2011, 8:30 a.m.–4:30 p.m.)

This coding workshop is presented by a medical record coder (an independent contractor of UDSMR) with the intent of closing the gap between coding for the IRF-PAI and coding for the bill. Emphasis is placed on the importance of developing a line of communication between the rehabilitation department and the medical records department to ensure that both documents represent each case appropriately.

The workshop includes scenarios that illustrate the differences in coding and outcomes when these forms are completed accurately. The target audience for this workshop is HIM directors, HIM coders, PPS coordinators, patient financial services staff, rehabilitation directors and case managers, and physiatrists.
