CMS will make significant changes to the IRF payment system effective October 1, 2019. This **two-day workshop** will provide you with everything you need to know in order to prepare your IRF team for these significant changes and make your program successful.

Inpatient rehabilitation program directors are responsible for maintaining programs that perform at a high level in quality, volume, and financial growth, but too often they are not provided with the education, tools, and resources they need to ensure efficient and effective operations. This workshop has been redesigned to prepare program directors for the new fiscal year and case-mix group payment system, which CMS has dramatically changed. Topics include census development and marketing, compliance and CMS policies, outcomes management, managing the new payment process, maximizing reimbursement, financial and budget planning, patient safety, and team development.
